



## **MUSIC THERAPIST**

We are looking for someone to join our team to fill the part-time position of Music Therapist.

### **ROLE PURPOSE:**

The Music Therapist is responsible for providing reassurance and support to patients and their families on their final journey in life with the use of music-based assessments and interventions.

### **PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES:**

- Assess all patients in written assessment form, formulate treatment plan with the involvement of the patients and families.
- Conduct sessions with patients and their family members as requested and as needed.
- Work as part of the multidisciplinary team, attend rounds and multidisciplinary meetings, record progress notes in medical charting and evaluate and adjust treatment plan accordingly.
- Continuously develop the application of Music Therapy using objective measures in accordance with research and evidence-based approach.
- Develop programs in accordance with patients and family needs.
- Actively participate in peer group supervision with supportive care team.
- Continuously develop and evolve the Music Therapy program.
- Plan and facilitate bereavement groups and workshops.
- Represent the Residence and the Music Therapy program to the wider community through conferences, seminars, etc.

### **GENERAL QUALIFICATIONS:**

- Master's degree in music therapy.
- Must be a member in good standing of the Canadian Association of Music Therapists.
- Minimum of 2 years' experience working as a Music Therapist.
- Previous experience in palliative care, an asset.
- Training and experience in the development of the group care process and in leading groups therapeutically.
- Excellent communication and interpersonal skills.
- Excellent organizational skills.
- Ability to work under pressure and manage competing priorities.
